Several classes of the Graphic Design, Interactive Media Design and Tailoring department participated in the first rounds of Lausanne 2020's mascot creation which were then put through several stages of selection and refinement, until finally Yodli was chosen.

THE NAME

Yodli – This name is inspired by yodelling or youtse, a song performed in Switzerland and in a part of France, the two countries where the Games will be held. Yodelling is used as a method of communication in the mountains by shepherds to call their herds. Yodli is well named because it is inspired by animals who are representative of Switzerland such as the Saint-Bernard, the goat and the cow, but also by the nomination "Youth Olympics" (YO) included in the beginning of the name. Please note that Yodli is gender non-specific.

THE ANIMAL

Yodli is a hybrid animal, composed of several emblematically Swiss animals, a cow, a goat and of course a Saint Bernard. All of these animals live in the mountains of Switzerland. They have different characteristics and relationships to their environment. Yodli incarnates the diversity of the participants of the Lausanne 2020 Youth Olympic Games.

THE STORY

Yodli was born and grew up in the Swiss mountains. Curious but shy, it lays in hiding watching humans as they practiced winter sports. One day, a child fell over and began to cry right next to where Yodli was hiding. Yodli was so touched by the little human's tears that it stepped out of its hiding place to console them and take them back to the town. There Yodli was praised by the townsfolk. Since then, our cute little hybrid doesn't hide anymore, Yodli even practices winter sports with the children of Lausanne.



YODLI IN SHORT:

The Name: Inspired by yodelling or youtse, a song performed in Switzerland and in a part of France. But also by the nomination "Youth Olympics" (YO) included in the beginning of the name.

The Animal: Yodli is a hybrid animal, composed of several emblematically Swiss animals, a cow, a goat and of course a Saint Bernard. All of these animals live in the mountains of Switzerland.

The Story: The curious and sporty hybrid was adopted by the Youth Olympic Games crew. Yodli's personality is shy but once you get to know it, it is jolly good fun. It is empathetic and likes to help others.

SIGNATURE POSE

THE LAUSANNE 2020 WINTER YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES MASCOT

To the right the mascot depicted in its Signature Pose. This pose is the default depiction of the mascot and is to be used for the majority of mascot applications. It is recommended that the mascot's name is featured in combination with the Signature Pose, especially when the mascot is being introduced for the first time. The mascot must be placed on monochrome or gradated backgrounds only or with very few details. The mascot must never be placed on a very busy background. The mascot can be placed on both light and dark backgrounds.



MASCOT'S NAME

THE LAUSANNE 2020 WINTER YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES MASCOT

It is recommended that the mascot's name is featured in combination with the Signature Pose in order to enhance the mascot recognition.


The name is written in the "Sanchez" font and is placed under the mascot.






PARTIAL USAGE AND SIZING

THE LAUSANNE 2020 WINTER YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES MASCOT

Usage of the partial mascot is allowed provided that the integrity of the the Lausanne 2020 Emblem is not compromised. Exception to this rule is allowed when the reproduction of the mascot is too small. When using the mascot partially, the general application guidelines and principles similar to those relating to the Signature Poses apply. Discretion may be exercised to leave room for design creativity. However, if in doubt, consult Lausanne 2020 for design approval.

The minimum recommended size for use of the mascot is 5 centimetres in height. This also applies to all alternative poses. If the mascot is desired in a smaller space, partial usage may be considered.







CLEAR SPACE

THE LAUSANNE 2020 WINTER YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES MASCOT

In order to ensure the completeness and integrity of the mascot's images, it is recommended that a minimum clear space equivalent to 10% of the full height is maintained. The height is taken from the lowest to the highest point of the mascot's body.

This is the first of the two alternative poses. Versions of this pose in greyscale and line art are available. A minimum clear space equivalent to 10% of the full height of the mascot's body should be maintained.

ALTERNATIVE POSES

This is the second of the two alternative poses. Versions of this pose in greyscale and line art are available. A minimum clear space equivalent to 10% of the full height of the mascot's body should be maintained. In addition to «#Lausanne2020» and Lausanne 2020's motto this pose can be produced with the sign messages «Welcome», «Willkommen» and «Bienvenue». Other sign messages can be commissioned for specific uses, but all designs and messages must be approved by Lausanne 2020 before use. Designs using any other colours or fonts* will not be approved.


